

CHAPTER PRESIDENT

The chapter president is responsible for monitoring the status of the Chapter. Under his direction, members progress through the year - participating in chapter, division, district and society activities. Through his efforts, members work together to accomplish the chapter's goals. His leadership sets the pace for the chapter's growth or decline. For this reason, careful consideration should be given to electing a president who will best serve the chapter.

Following are some of the duties of a chapter president:

- Serve on the chapter board, acting as moderator for meetings and planning the board meeting agenda.
- Serve as spokesman for the chapter.
- Make committee assignments.
- Supervise the work of chapter committees and follow-up on reported projects.
- Head the chapter's leadership team which includes the elected officers.
- Supervise the work of the Secretary and Treasurer to make sure all necessary forms are filed and money correctly disbursed.
- Be knowledgeable about the duties of other chapter officers.
- Oversee the planning of the yearly calendar of chapter activities.
- Develop the chapter budget with input from other officers and committees.
- Assess the chapters progress during the year and re-direct the yearly plan if necessary.
- Evaluate the performance of the elected officers and correct any inappropriate behavior by reprimand or request for resignation.
- Attend the District Chapter Officer Training School.
- Represent the Chapter at the District House of Delegates meeting.
- Act as Chapter liaison with the District Chapter Counselor.
- Be informed about the purposes of the Society and the role the chapter plays in it.
- Provide the creative spark to keep barbershopping fun and exciting for all chapter members.
- Function as ex-officio member of all chapter committees.
